New Business

1) Chestermere/Indus Modified Mixed Bonspiel

- a) Update on registered teams
- b) CRCA has indicated that the bar will be open before/after games in Chestermere

2) Benefits from Lethbridge 2022 Tim Hortons Brier

a) Due to volunteers from our club helping with this event, we received a cheque for \$700 from their Host Committee.

Funds will be deposited to General Revenue.

3) Curling Club Championship Playoffs

- a) Marla has registered a spot for our Men's and Women's league champions to play in the Curling Club Championship playoff.
- b) Total cost was \$1004 (\$502/team) (regular fund)
- c) Games will be held March 9th to 12, 2023. Men's play at Huntington Hills and Women's play at Coaldale Granite Curling Club.

4) Lounge

a) Apparently, the shutter doors for the bar are broken and as a result, the lounge doors must be locked if the bar is not open.

Shutter doors have been fixed. No longer an issue.

b) Marla did write the CRCA regarding the lounge closing at 10:00pm. They have indicated that the bar will remain open Monday and Tuesday nights for the late draw curlers to come up. Further, the lounge will remain open while there are customers present.

5) Community Grant

- a) We can apply for funding from a Community Grant opportunity as mentioned in an email that was distributed December 5th, 2022.

a) Chestermere Minor Hockey is trying to our City of Chestermere council to focus on recreational facilities in Chestermere. They are hoping that other recreation groups will write letters to City Council to ask for a clear recreational plan for our community.

Nick will reach out to Avery about penning a letter from the Curling Curling Club, to the City of Chestermere, regarding the above.

9) Possible resurrection of the City Championships

a) At the Calgary and Area Curling Club Manager Association meeting on January 11, 2023, there is a possibility that the City Championships may be resurrected if not this season, then possibly in 2024. The host clubs would alternate hosting from one year to the next between Springbank and the Winter Club if an agreement can be made.

10) Novice Curler Bonspiel

- a) Curling Alberta is holding a bonspiel for Novice only curlers (5 year's experience or less) February 17, 18, 19th 2023 at the North Hill Curling Club. Cost is \$375/team. Top 2 teams qualify for a provincial competition on March 9th to 12th in Airdrie.

11) Replacement Stabilizers

a) We have had a few more stabilizers fail. Marla would like to purchase 4 additional units (Casino fund eligible).

Marla purchased 4 new Stabilizers.

b) Marla is putting together U12 junior curling teams to enter into the Strathmore Funspiel and the CYCA Jam Can Funspiel at the Calgary Curling Club, both are taking place in February.

12) Curling Clinic with Olympians

- a) The U of C is doing a fund raiser by hosting a curling clinic. Ben Hebert, Brett Gallant, and Cheryl Bernard will offer on ice skills improvement and coaching. This is followed by "ask me anything".
- b) January 23rd at the Calgary Curling Club starting at 4:30pm. Cost \$75 + tax. (includes flat bread and beer).
- c) The event may be full as the only option I saw was "Add me to the waitlist".

13) Safe Sport Certification

- a) Curling Alberta is aiming to have all member clubs be "Safe Sport Certified" by the end of 2023. To do this we need to:
 - i) Adopt a suite of suggested Safe Sport Policies developed in collaboration with Curling Canada including a code of conduct, harassment and ethics, volunteer screening policy, athlete protection policy, abuse policy, whistleblower policy, and a discipline and complaints policy. ii) Have all staff, board members, coaches and program volunteers complete the online Safe Sport training module provided by the Coaching Association of Canada. The training is available at no charge and takes less than 90 minutes.
 - iii) Require Police checks (including vulnerable sector checks) for all staff, board members, coaches and volunteers working with vulnerable populations.
 - iv) Ensure your Curling Centre staff and board members complete a 90 minute Diversity Equity and Inclusion module as assigned by Curling Alberta.
- b) Once completed, we will receive a "Safe Sport Certified" window sticker.

14) Curling Alberta includes Canva benefit

a) Marla has signed up for it but states "Cheryl McDonald has access to it and added my email address so that I could try this program to make up a poster or facebook post but I do not have the patience to figure it out.
